WHAT TO DO:

- Check out the list of participating colleges/universities.
- Make sure you meet the institution's criteria.
- Make sure the institution of your choice offers the major area of study you are interested in pursuing.
- Call/email the LSP if you don't see a school listed that you are interested in attending.
- Fill out the online application and gather your submission materials.

WHAT TO SUBMIT:

With most applications you will be asked to submit the following:

- Screening Board Report.
- One copy of High School transcripts (Unofficial).
- One copy of College transcripts (Unofficial).
- SMART Transcript.
- Certified true copies of NAVMC 118 (3); (11); AND (12).
- Certified true copies of ROS, BIR, BTR, AWARDS PAGE, AND EDUCATION RECORD (TEDU).
- Letters of Recommendation (Optional).
- Personal essay of 250 words.
