Our mission at the Family Advocacy Program is to intervene and protect victims through the many services we have available. We offer emotional support, crisis intervention, help obtaining restraining orders, accompaniment to court or medical appointments, education and referrals to other resources.

Domestic Violence Reporting Options

We understand how difficult it can be to report domestic violence and we would like you to know that there are two reporting options for active duty military members and their dependents.

RESTRICTED REPORTING

Allows adult victims to confidentially report and receive services without initiating an official investigation.

To receive a Restricted Report, you must only report to the:

- Victim Advocate
- Victim Advocate Supervisor
- Health Care Provider (in most states)

Talk to your Victim Advocate about exceptions in the state of California for Restricted Reporting.

UNRESTRICTED REPORTING

Allows adult victims of abuse to report and receive services as well as initiate an official investigation.

To receive a Unrestricted Report, you can report to the:

- Victim Advocate
- Law Enforcement
- Command

If you choose unrestricted reporting, the abuser may be held accountable and you can enlist the help of the command for a Military Protective Order and financial support.
